

Concentrated Home Made Laundry Soap.



1cup of Oxi Clean

1/2 cup of Borax & 1 cup of Arm & Hammer Washing Soda & Bar of Fel Naptha Bars Soap

Take the bar of Fels Naptha bars soap, (laundry bar soap) & grate it on a cheese grater using the whole bar. Pour 4 cups of water into a sauce pan & add the grated soap. Cook on low until fully dissolved, remove from heat & add 1 cup of washing soda, & 1/2 cup of Borax to the sauce pan & stir until dissolved.

Use a five gallon bucket from Home Depot with a lid fro this project. Fill the bucket half full with hot water, then add the contents of the sauce pan & stir well. Fill the bucket the rest of the way up with water.

You can just leave it as a concentrate,I saved my old laundry containers & the measuring cap on top is small for using it as a concentrate. Stir well, & you can add essential oils for fragrance at 15 drops per gallon if you want, but the soap smells fine on it's own. You can get the oil cheap at Michael's craft Store. I found the super washing soda at Ace hardware. The rest at the grocery stores.

Be sure to keep in containers and if it looks like milk when you shake it, then it is correct. I make the 5 gallons, then filled up my old laundry containers. Give it a good shake before you use it. I hope this helps out some of you in these hard times. It cost about \$10.00 to get started, plus the cost of Oxi clean, but you will have enough product to last you for a good year. This soap works great, and your whites will be really white.

The Fel Naptha bar soap only cost around \$2.00, so the next time you make 5 gallons of laundry soap it will only cost you \$2.00 each time until you run out of all the other items. This is the recipe that I used, made it, tried & loved it.
